Course Components – Why we need financial assistance

Three basic components go into course design

Disc Baskets – Are the most important element of a good course, but unfortunately it can be the most expensive.

Tee Signs – Are located at each tee and provide players with a miniature map of the current hole.

Tee Pads – Provide a firm and level foundation to start play. Typically tee pads are composed of poured concrete slabs.

As well, a practice putting hole, garbage cans, benches, bathrooms...etc Luckily, we have a few of these items readily available to us at Riverview.

A qualified course design will not only consist of the best holes with the best flow for our course, but it will also be able to identify variables that the original course wasn’t able to account for, such as essential technical and safety issues. (ie: Current hole 9 pin position) Additional concerns that a qualified design would adhere to; prevailing winds, potential erosion, water pooling, tree and plant protection, and most importantly the elimination of the potential for “run-away” discs entering a street, playground, or picnic area. **An ideal course design will last for decades and cater to all levels of play and players.**
